Dear Honorable Chief Judge Linares:

On April 22, 2018, I completed my response to the Government's Supplemental Opposition submission, on the four claims, in my 28 U.S.C. § 2255 motion.

At this institution you are not only stymied in your ability to do any meaningful legal research, submit and edit a typed response and be psychologically stable; but your writings to even a Court are submitted to the government, and must be approved before a Special Investigative Service (SIS) official can place in the United States Mail. Moreover, you are at the mercy of the institution and your Unit Team to make copies.

This Honorable Court must be cognizant that SIS logged my reply into their records on April 29, 2018 and it was electronically scanned and sent to the government on that

date. Even though the government was late in replying with their submission and intentionally contravened this Honorable Court's Order, I wanted to make sure my writing was logged and sent by May 1, 2018, in compliance with Your Order; even though I was not given the government's response until 9 April 2018, late in the afternoon.

To date, the government has deliberately delayed my submission to you. It has not been approved (emphasis added), for mailing to the Court and I plead for your assistance. The government's actions are appalling, sadistic and wrong. In their devious minds they truly believe they could do whatever they please, even if wholly dishonorable to the law, statute and the Constitution. You will clearly see this when you read my motion and hear the testimony of witnesses.

There is no legal justification nor viable excuse for their devious misconduct; other than the fact that the closer we get to the truth, the more misconduct and criminality you will witness. It is consistent with their designating me to this replicated concentration camp, only subsequent to their being served and scrutinizing my 2255 motion.

I am extremely frustrated and upset by the government's treachery and purposefully delaying my submission and wanted to make this Court cognizant of their disheartening antics.
