Please be informed that on the above date I received the government's requests for an extension to respond to Petitioner's Motion to Vacate, Set Aside, or Correct a Sentence made pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2255.

Please excuse the fact that this letter is handwritten, but there are no typewriters, word processors or other means available for me to respond. I sincerely apologize.

This Honorable Court acted in the interests of justice and Ordered the government to respond to my motion by 31 July 2017. Most importantly,

based upon the government's plethora of adjournments, continuances and delays and the inordinate amount of time the government had to respond, this Court Ordered "no further delays or continuances."

I vehemently pray, plead and implore the Court to deny the government's adjournment request. Despite the government's veiled and baseless excuses, as well as fabricated accusations, they must meet this deadline.
