For the reasons stated in the Opinion filed herewith:

IT IS this 15 day of November, 2018,

ORDERED that petitioner’s motion to vacate, set aside or correct his sentence pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2255 is denied in part; all of petitioner’s claims are denied except for the following:

1. Claim V – Part v – Whether trial counsel was ineffective for failing to investigate/call Hakeem Curry and Rakeem Baskerville as witnesses.
2. Claim XXX Part ii – Failure to provide petitioner with a copy of Roderick Boyd’s F.B.I. 302 report.
3. Claim XXIX – Cumulative ineffective assistance of counsel claim in light of this Court conducting an evidentiary hearing on Claim V, Part v.

and it is further

ORDERED that a certificate of appealability shall not issue on the denied claims; and it is further

ORDERED that an evidentiary hearing shall be conducted on the claims outlined above that have not been denied; and is further

ORDERED that counsel shall be appointed to represent petitioner pursuant to Habeas Rule 8(c); and it is further

ORDERED that the Court will schedule a conference call with the parties once counsel is appointed in order to schedule an evidentiary hearing on the claims listed above; and it is further

ORDERED that petitioner's request and motion to expand the record (ECF 36 & 43) are granted; and it is further

ORDERED that respondent shall file a response to petitioner's motion to expand the record (ECF 40) within twenty-one (21) days of the date of this Order; and it is further

ORDERED that petitioner may file a reply to respondent's response to the motion to expand the record within twenty-one (21) days of respondent's filing, or within twenty-one (21) days of counsel's appointment in this matter, whichever is later; and it is further,

ORDERED that the Clerk shall serve a copy of this Order and the accompanying Opinion on petitioner by regular U.S. mail.
